

"Christmas is not only getting too commercial, it's getting too dangerous."
-Linus-

As Linus spoke these words in the great Christmas classic "A Charlie Brown Christmas," he was referring to a threat he had just experienced from his sister Lucy. As I hear those words today, I believe there is truth to them in a different sentiment.

Rachel and I have shared a Christmas tradition of decorating our home for Christmas while listening to Christmas music. As we finish the decorating, I would make peppermint hot cocoa, and we would watch "A Charlie Brown Christmas". Needless to say, I hold this short film in high regard due to the tremendous nostalgic feeling it breathes into my soul. The season of Christmas, more accurately titled Advent, brings me great joy. I have listened to so much Christmas music that our 8 year-old son, Owen, chooses to listen to it as he falls asleep many nights throughout the year, whether it is December or July.

I find great joy in Christmas because I find it awe-inspiring that God would choose to enter our experience and be present among us in the flesh. I am amazed at the story of so many people waiting and wondering what God was going to do with the prophecy of a Messiah; even more so, how and why God choose to fulfill it. This baby boy came into the world to flip perspective, priorities, and principalities upside down.

"He has pulled the powerful down from their thrones and lifted-up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty-handed. He has come to the aid of Israel, remembering his mercy."

As I hear Linus' words, stated above, it strikes me a little different this year. Is the Church living into the true Christmas message? Advent is a season to remember not only the Christmas story, but the reason God came as "Immanuel" in the first place. Several characters speak to the purpose of this miraculous child before he can ever speak a word for himself. Mary, Elizabeth, Simeon, Anna, and others speak about how this baby will grow into a man who upsets the power structures of the current culture and bring in a new kingdom. Not only is Christmas becoming too commercial, but it could become

- detrimental, even dangerous for the church. The Church must stop using
- Christmas to support itself, focusing on its own joys above those of others.
- The Savior came to alter our corporate and personal understanding of why we are here. "Immanuel", God with us, is not just then but now. God was, is, and will always be present with us. And if Mary, Elizabeth, Simeon, Anna, and others are accurate, God's presence brings great hope to the poor, downtrodden, broken, and hurting before it brings hope to anyone else.

May Grace UMC be a people that shares this Christmas message during the Advent season and in all seasons. Whatever structure here on earth is bringing you down, God is present with you working to dismantle that structure and bring in the reign of Jesus Christ. We were formed to live as Jesus has called us to serve rather than be served, to love when love is unfitting, and give without expectation of return. Merry Christmas! May you be blessed by the living and loving presence of God through Jesus Christ in tandem with the Holy Spirit.
